

Tubular Scarf

Size 22cm wide by 220cm full circle (8½" by 86") – For Beginner or Intermediate

Requirements:

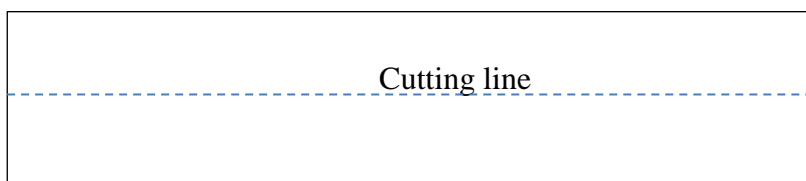
- Fabric 1 - ½ metre
- Fabric 2 - ½ metre
- Thread to match or contrast

Contrasting fabric colours look great!

Method:

Cut fabric 1 and fabric 2 in half lengthwise (diagram 1)

Diagram 1



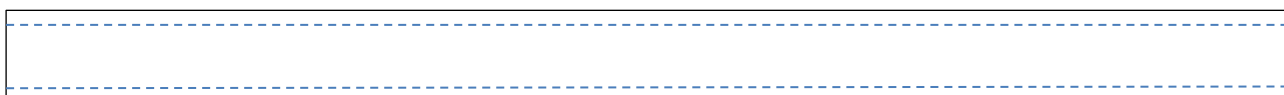
You now have 2 pieces of fabric 1 and 2 pieces of fabric 2. Place 2 pieces of fabric 1 together, with right sides facing and machine stitch together the 2 short ends (diagram 2) using ½" seam. Press seam flat open. Repeat this process for fabric 2.

You now have 2 long lengths of fabric. Take the 2 lengths of fabric and place right sides together and machine stitch down the two long edges. (Diagram 3)

Press the seams flat open and trim the seams to ¼". Turn the tube so that the right sides are facing out. Press so that the two long seams are at either side of the scarf (i.e. edges)

Fold the scarf in half so that the two open short ends are right sides together, pin the two ends of fabric 1 together and continue pinning either side of fabric 1 going in to fabric 2 approximately 1" to 2" leaving a gap of 4" to 5" then machine stitch a ½" seam along your pinned line. You are left with a gap to slip stitch closed by hand.
